

RE-OPENING OF SCHOOL TO YEARS 10 AND 12

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQs)

My child has been identified as high need, I want to support them, can you tell me what their classifications were?

We are working on a report to do this. Students have been prioritised by using a filtering system starting on Monday 15th June and working down through the core subjects next week, we have been able to invite 120 students in to school by the end of the first week, some of the students later in the week have moderate and even low needs in some of the core subjects.

Do they wear uniform?

Students should wear smart casual clothes that can be easily washed after school, they are not allowed to wear baseball caps and have hoods up. If his school shirt and trousers can easily be washed then they can wear those if they choose.

The school day finishes at 2.30pm their bus does not come until 3.30 pm, what does they do?

Students who have to wait for their school bus will remain in their classroom supervised until 3.30 pm, they can do some work from other subjects as they would from home. They will then be escorted to the buses at a social distance of 2m.

My child has not been asked to come to school, why?

We have been asked to see year 10 and 12 as a priority, we have then applied a need classification system to make numbers manageable and put safety for all first. Your child's needs have been assessed as not being in the first tranche of priorities for school action. This is good and you and your child should be congratulated for this, managing to cope well with home learning! We are aiming to see every child at least once before the summer holiday, more invites will follow in due course.

Do students move classroom?

No, they will remain in the same room, in the same seat all day and teachers will move to them. At break and lunch they will move 2m apart to the lunch area and again sit at a social distance to eat.

What about cleaning?

We have a team of fully trained cleaners who will move in to classrooms at each break and lunchtime and conduct a full cleaning regime according to HSE guidelines. Where will lunch be eaten and can you guarantee the tables will be disinfected before he eats?

Lunch will be taken by all students at a safe social distance of 2m in the Glasspool Yard and under the Glasspool canopy, there are tables and picnic benches set out at a safe distance to do this. Will student toilets be regularly cleaned throughout the day?

Yes and student access to these will also be controlled by staff.

Is it the same next week (W/C 22/06/20) for Year 10?

The current plan is that Year 10 will alternate each week between core and options subjects. The week commencing 15/06/20 is for core subjects and the week after there will be a similar process for Option subjects. We may repeat the systems in a similar way in the remaining three weeks before summer. Invitations will always be sent out to parents and students in the week prior each time.

What will option subject week look like?

Option week is a varied week with different days assigned to various subjects, as our timetable is so varied and provides multiple combinations of subjects, it is not possible to ensure that all students will do 3 sessions per day based upon their chosen subjects. However, we have tried to maximise the number of sessions for each student per day as far as possible when setting up the subject rotations. There will be supervised sessions for open study for some students, so students should bring work with them from any subject that they can do in school as though they were working from home.
