#### CASHLESS CATERING - LAUNCH DATE 21st NOVEMBER 2016

With effect from Monday 21<sup>st</sup> November 2016 all catering sales will be cashless and there will be no facility for cash sales on site with the exception of the drink vending machines.

As a reminder for parents we are making these changes to realise the following benefits:

- Detailed parental online reporting of student purchases from all school catering outlets
- Easy online credit top-ups with debit or credit card
- Option of PayPoint top-ups at local stores for those parents who don't wish to pay online
- Elimination of the need for students to carry cash to purchase their break-time snacks and lunch
- Assurance for parents that their money is being spent for the purpose it was given
- No risk of money being lost
- · Reduced risk of bullying
- Easy and discrete administration for free school meals

Please note that the **Free School Meals daily allowance will increase to £3.20 per day** when cashless catering is introduced which will allow eligible children to enjoy a snack and a drink at breaktime and a hot meal and drink at lunchtime. #### WIRRAL COUNCIL APPEALS FOR PICTURES TO HELP REPLACE STOLEN THURSTASTON PLAQUE

Wirral Council is taking action to replace the brass map which was stolen in August from the viewing point at the top of Thurstaston Hill and which has not been found. The plaque sat on a sandstone plinth at the highest point on the hill, and guided visitors to the panoramic views across the Dee to North Wales and the Mersey to Liverpool.

The replacement plaque will be produced using photographs of the original brass map – and that's where local people can help. The Council has some images which will help to produce the new plaque, but members of the public can help by sharing their photographs of the map in its former glory. The Council is keen to ensure that the new plaque is in keeping with the tradition of what was there previously and that it highlights how valuable the site is to the local community and visitors.
